

Food & Lodging

Camping / RV:

A wide variety of campsites are available at the Anderson Camping Area. Some sites are shaded, others are open and grassy. All have picnic tables and fire pits. Two utility buildings include showers and flush toilets. Here are site prices:

- Tent without hookups \$27/night
- RV with electric & water \$42/night
- RV with electric, water & sewer \$47/night

Note: one car or non-RV per site. One tent, trailer or RV per site. One additional pup tent allowed per site. A dump station is also available.



Cabins:

A limited number of rustic cabins are available near the camping area (not by lake). Book early! Cooking and dining equipment is provided in most cabins. Guests make beds on arrival.

- Anderson (sleeps 6) \$70/night
- St. Louis (sleeps 4) \$100/night
- St. Louis (sleeps 4 + 1) \$125/night
- Walbett (sleeps 4 + 1) \$125/night
- Killian (sleeps 4 + 1) \$140/night

Hotel:

Rooms are available in Roger Williams Inn with a queen and a single bed for \$114/night for up to two adults and their children. Add \$15 per night for each additional adult.

Meals:

Tired of camp cooking? Eat any meals at the buffet-style dining hall overlooking the lake. Breakfast \$8.50, Lunch \$10.00, Dinner \$12.50

Activities:

If you like to run and play:

The Green Lake Conference Center is a great place to enjoy God's creation, with many trails and small roads to explore the fields, woods, and lake views. Or climb Judson Tower to get a spectacular view 200 feet above the lake. The conference grounds are also ideal for family biking.

Note: Bicycles, golf, boats, and boat docking are available for rent. Or bring your own equipment.

The craft building offers instruction and a broad assortment of supplies to make beautiful stained glass, ceramics, painted china, and lapidary (jewelry) projects at reasonable prices.

The towns of Green Lake and Ripon are also nearby, offering opportunities for shopping, eating, and recreation. The Padelford Country Store is located in the camping area for the purchase of food and supplies.

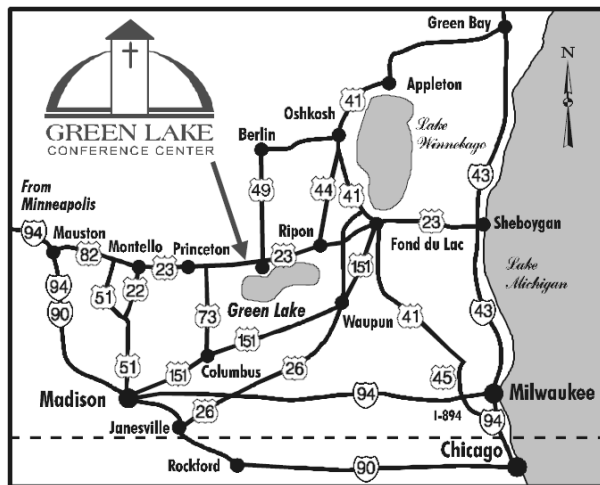
Fees:

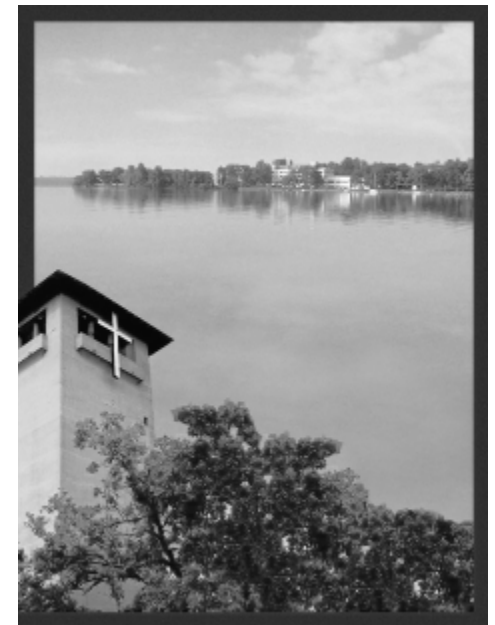
